

WHAT DOES GMP LOOK LIKE?

Most kratom companies are following the FDA's Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP). In order to make sure, you must request the Certificate of Analysis and Microbes test from your kratom vendor. With these two test requirements, companies will be adhering to a certain standard of product quality and will have likely demonstrated their responsibility to follow GMP standards.



For example, a vendor should have a protocol (Standard Operating Procedure or SOP) for what happens when their product does not reach the accepted level of quality from their lab results. A SOP must exist to send product back, document the process, and remedy the situation.

A SOP should exist for all regularly occurring business processes, whether that is Labeling Jars, Receiving Bulk Product, Sending Test Samples to Labs, etc.. When a process doesn't go according to plan, there must be a SOP that includes steps to resolve the issue.



The advantage of having a wide array of uniformly set practices is to uphold a certain standard of quality for every product, which can be relied upon time and time again for replicable results.

There is no room for error when vendors are selling a product that is meant for human consumption. This is why every single kratom vendor must adhere to Good Manufacturing Practices. We encourage you to discover whether your vendor abides by GMP before continuing to provide them with business.
